Communication between and among students, teachers, staff, and parents is vital to a healthy school atmosphere.

The following guidelines/policies are specific to the sixth grade. They are in compliance to the list that is found in the student agenda book. Please refer to both as needed.

Homework Policy:

- •Important part of learning process directly connected to classroom instruction
- •Due the next day unless otherwise notified by classroom teacher
- Late or missing may result in a reduction of points or a zero
- •Expected to be completed in a neat and legible fashion in format assigned by the teacher

Sixth grade students who consistently complete their homework on time will be eligible for a variety of awards intended to reinforce positive academic behavior.

Detentions:

Detentions may be given as a consequence for those behaviors detrimental to the learning process.

Detentions could be served before or after school, or possibly during lunch at the teachers' discretion. Parents will be notified in a timely fashion for those detentions that would require transportation outside of the daily schedule.

Tardies

Please be aware that the Gateway staff is very sympathetic to sixth graders still "finding their way" during the first weeks of the school year. The policies listed below will not go into effect until students have been given a reasonable opportunity to orient themselves to their new surroundings and schedules.

The classroom teacher for may give Tardies:

- arriving past the bell
- unprepared for class

3 accumulated tardies may result in a team detention.

Class Supplies

Students should have the supplies that were on the supply list given out before school started. They should be replenished as necessary. Pencils are always in high demand. Please be careful to purchase the correct calculator as described on the supply list.

Cell phone/Electronics

Cellular/electronic devices are to be kept turned off and stored in the student's locker upon arrival at school each day. Any student requiring to call home during the day must use an office phone.
